Nora Gross (Registrar and Queen of Everything) and her team of helpers, Jackolynn Coughlin, Murielle LeBlanc and Rosalie Seidelman provided each artist with an amazing gift bag well filled with Prismacolor watercolour pencils, signature CSPWC Sharpies and tons of other treats. Soon followed by a wine and cheese get together, everyone joined in celebrating the beginning of a week at Art Camp!

The College was just finishing extensive renovations, so the guest rooms were newly decorated with in-suite baths, fresh paint, new mattresses and beddings, while the classroom spaces had also been renewed and expanded. Hall for the evening events and guest speakers. It was not like any camp I have ever been to.

On the Tuesday evening, despite the lovely weather, artists gathered to hear Andrea Warren, the Golden Acrylic representative speak about



the various products and uses of the Golden paints and mediums. Andrea finished her talk by giving beautiful sample kits and colour charts to everyone in attendance.

The Wednesday night ceilidh is always a big hit with the participants. Watching those toes tap and the fiddlers making those strings dance, is something you

never forget! The CEO of the college, Rodney MacDonald, along with Tracy Dares, Buddy MacDonald and Michael McMillan put on a first class Gaelic music night to the delight of the crowd. Many of the artists had never seen a ceilidh.



Jury Day: *Open Water* 2012

As the end of the summer was cooling down, we held the jurying for *Open* Water 2012 at our Wallace Avenue office on Sept 6th with over 240 submissions. As only 40 paintings are accepted for the J.B.Aird Gallery/Galerie J.B. Aird, it was a focused day. While almost half of the entries came from non-Members, 18 artists from outside of Canada submitted images. The increased reach internationally while reducing costs for the Society to put on a major international exhibition was aided by using the internet for advertising and for the first time, payment could be made on-line through PayPal and the images sent via email. The number of entrants who took advantage of this was 90% of the entries.

We were very lucky this year to obtain the services of Ms. Betty Ann Jordan, of ArtInSite, as the Guest Juror. Ms. Jordan's articles and columns have appeared in Canadian House and Home, Toronto Life, Where Toronto, Essential Toronto, Azure, Toronto (November 2008), The Globe and Mail. The National Post, American

Style, Canadian Art, Art News, Fashion, Elm Street, and many other periodicals. She has led courses on art appreciation for the Classical Pursuits program, the Adult Education program of the Art Gallery of Ontario, and the Museum of Contemporary Canadian Art. Our CSPWC Member Jurors were Past President, Marc L. Gagnon and 2011 A.J. Casson Award Winner, Pat Fairhead.

While Marc came in from Newscastle that morning. Pat came the distance from Bracebridge the day before, both showing that distance wasn't a factor to helping out. Member Karin Isenberg. who also drove in from Courtice that morning, acted as proctor while our Administrator, Anita Cotter, kept us all organized with the appropriate papers.

The jurors combined experience and knowledge of art, plus a willingness to work together efficiently, made the day an easy one for Karin, Anita and myself. That was a large group to sort through and the final selection will make an absolutely beautiful exhibition. Thank you to all for helping accomplish this.


CATALOGUES OPEN WATER 2012

GLENDA LEA (FERNEAU) BEAVER

Glenda, a CSPWC Member since 2001, died in 2011. Glenda's life long passion for art started at a young age. A bachelors degree in art, teacher training in art and 2 years of Post Graduate art studies provided a well rounded back ground that lead her to pursue art as a profession. Having studied watercolour under such artists as Edgar Whitney, Doris McCarthy, Szoltan Szabo and Frank Web she made her contribution by conducting many of her own watercolour classes and workshops.

She wrote and produced a book and 2 instructional videos on watercolour techniques. She painted in watercolour exclusively since 1977 and enjoyed international achievements travelling twice to Europe to exhibit. She was represented by 10 commercial galleries in Alberta and one in Mall of America. Glenda Beaver's watercolours interpreted nature in ways that showed her love of creation and our creator. Her paintings were sensitive and radiant, and visually communicated serenity.

group, the South Delta Artists Guild in which she invested a lot of care and energy in its growth and viability. Her critiques at the Guild were especially sought after. She also taught at the University Women's Club and critiqued at the FCA. She was a fabulous juror, and could make quick judgments, even in a show of 750 applicants.

In 2000, she had a work selected for the Royal Collection and much enjoyed the later presentation at Canada House, and visiting the home of Prince Charles and viewing his private collection.

Ruth has left us with her enthusiasm and perseverance.

GEORGE STRACHAN

George Strachan a CSPWC member since 2000 died on Sept 13, 2011 in Michigan. He was born in 1920 in Aberdeen, Scotland but moved to the United States where he took business administration at Wayne State University and then a graduate degree in commerce from Indiana University. He eventually became the senior vice president and comptroller of Standard Federal Savings and Loan. He died at age 91.

His artist's statement reads: "Painting provides me with an avenue of adventure and self discovery, an area

of freedom in which I search things out for myself and find my own way. I paint in the realist tradition constantly seeking out new subject matter. I dislike repetition so with each painting I challenge myself in capturing difficult and different situations."

He was also a member of the Grosse Pointe Artists, Anton Art Club, Lakeshore Art Society and the Toronto Art Gallery, Grosse Pointe Rose Society, the Grosse Pointe Camera Club and the American Legion.

Editor's Pick: Tales of Member's Big Adventures

PLEIN AIR EASTON AND BILL ROGERS

Plein Air Easton, in Easton Maryland is one of the major plein air competitions with a \$5000 first prize after a week long paint in, this year with 58 juried artists. Visit the website (www.pleinaireaston.com) to get more details and take some time to enjoy the video blog that was produced during the festival. Early March of the year is the deadline for submissions and from over 300 entries 58 artists were invited to the show



which runs in mid July on Chesapeake Bay in Maryland. As is true of many plein air events oil or acrylic is the major medium but the video blog pointed out that one of the trends for the event is an increasing number of watercolour painters. Bill Rogers of Antigonish, Nova Scotia was one of the participants selected this year out of a pool of over 300 applicants.

Starting in 2005 the event has garnered significant support from collectors who this year purchased over \$200,000 in paintings in the three days of the final gallery display. Each artist displays two of their plein air paintings from the week's work but is allowed to either create or bring with them up to 10 paintings and if one of the 2 selected paintings is sold then another from their set of 10 can be displayed in the main show. EDMONTON ARTIST PAINTING AND PUBLISHING

Jennifer Annesley will present her annual one day exhibition on Nov 8, 2012 at the Fairmont Hotel in Edmonton. Her recent travels to Hungary, Poland and Italy are the foundation of this year's architectural paintings, from the elegant cities of Milan and Florence to exotic Budapest and medieval Krakow. This year's landscapes are based on the artist's backcountry experiences in the Rocky Mountains and on the Bowron Lakes canoe circuit in British Columbia.

Two of Annesley's watercolours won a place in the hardcover book Splash 14, Light and Colour from more than 1500 worldwide entries. Edited by Rachel Rubin Wolf, it will be published by North Light Books in June 2013. This is the second North Light publication for Jennifer; last year, three of her charcoal drawings were included in Strokes of Genius, The Best of Drawing.

The Federation of Canadian Artists accepted two charcoal

drawings into their International Drawing Competition in Vancouver, B.C., one of which won the FCA's Award of Excellence.

Three of Annesley's landscape paintings

CSPWC IS GOING TO MEXICO!

The CSPWC has been invited to participate in the 9th International Mexico Biennial at the Museo Nacional de la Acuarela, in Coyoacán, México. Since the inauguration of World Watercolour Day the biennial has been timed to be a part of those celebrations. World Watercolour Day is on Nov 23 and the exhibition will run from Dec 2012 to Feb 2013 and include works from over twenty countries.

The Biennial was established by the late Maestro Alfredo Guati Rojo in 1994. The CSPWC/SCPA was first invited to participate in 1996. Since then six artists have been selected to represent the CSPWC/SCPA at each biennial.



Over fifty CSPWC members have participated in these exhibitions since 1996.

Because of the enormity of pieces to be exhibited, the exhibition is divided in two groups according the alphabetical order of the participating countries. The first group exhibition will take place from Dec 2, 2012 to Jan 6,2013, with the second group exhibiting from Jan 13 to Feb 17, 2013. The artists will be selected by the Board of Directors

News on the Arts

PAINTING CANADA: TOM THOMPSON AND THE GROUP OF SEVEN

McMichael Gallery Nov 3, 2012 to Jan 6, 2013 by Bill Atkinson

This international exhibition of some of Canada's greatest art is making its only appearance in North America at the McMichael gallery (http://www.mcmichael.com/index.cfm) at the end of the year. It has been organized by the Dulwich Picture Gallery (http://www.dulwichpicturegallery.org. uk/) in London England and the National Gallery of Canada (http://www.gallery.ca/en/). It includes 122 paintings of the group and perhaps more exciting for artists a significant number of sketches.

The exhibition is framed between

Tom Thompson's classic views of Algonquin park's lakes and trees and Lawren Harris's spare and powerful visions from the Great Lakes to the Arctic. Wherever possible the finished work is presented with the initial sketch, an invitation to watch the creative process in action. The exhibition has as well brought together a significant number of paintings held by individual collectors and

not usually seen by the public.

Ian Dejardin, Director at Dulwich Picture Gallery, said, "These artists produced some of the most vibrant and beautiful landscapes of the 20th century. The Canadians have kept this particular light under a bushel for far too long – I am proud, and frankly amazed, that this is to be the very first major exhibition of their work to be held in this country since the sensation of their first showing here in 1924.

As for Tom Thomson – what he achieved in his tragically short career (just five years) is extraordinary. He is Canada's very own Van Gogh. We were

thrilled with the public response to this exhibition and in fact, the exhibition broke records for the largest single day attendance in our history."

If you can't make it to the exhibit the catalog will be available through the McMichael Gallery but they also plan to make available some virtual tours so check out their web site as the year progresses.

WE NEED MORE APPLICANTS

This is a plea to all Members and Associates to encourage outstanding watercolour artists that you know to apply for membership in the society. This past year we had the lowest number of new applicants in recent memory, nineteen. I think we can do better.

If you know of any good watercolourists who are not members, please suggest they apply for membership. The application form is on the society web site www.cspwc. com. Potential applicants need only go to the "Become a Member" link to see the application form which contains all the information needed to apply. The annual deadline for applications to be submitted to the Toronto office is Nov 1.

A typical response heard when suggesting someone apply is: "I'm not good enough yet." I tell them why not let the jury decide that? Another common response is: "What's in it for me?" The answer is that the benefits are numerous:

- a member joins a select group of professional watercolourists, and enjoys camaraderie and support from peers
- members are eligible to enter Members' Exhibitions and participate in national and international activities
 - members may use the initials CSPWC after their names
 - members receive the society quarterly Newsletter
- members receive reduced entry fees to Open Water **Exhibitions and Symposiums**
- membership is a recognized watercolour painting teaching credential
- members meet some wonderful fellow watercolour artists from all across Canada.

In other words, Elected Membership opens doors. So this plea is not just about numbers. It's about the best watercolour artists becoming part of, and contributing, to the future of the society.
