





David Silcox has had a distinguished and varied career as a writer, educator, cultural administrator and arts advocate. Currently the president of Sotheby's Canada, Silcox first emerged on the Canadian art scene at Hart House at the University of Toronto; in 1961, he helped organize the massive Canadian Conference of the Arts at Toronto's O'Keefe Centre; he also organized the first Toronto Outdoor Art Exhibition. In 1962, The Globe and Mail – where he later worked as art critic – named him "Man of the Year in Art." In 1965, he joined the Canada Council as its first Arts Officer; over the next five years, he helped create a system of grants for artists and arts organizations. In 1970, he moved to York University to help shape the new Faculty of Fine Arts. Before joining Sotheby's, Silcox was the director of the University of Toronto Art Centre. He has served on the boards of numerous cultural organizations and has written several outstanding books on Canadian art and artists, including David Milne and the Group of Seven. He wrote a chapter in Art at Work/Art au Travail, a history of the Canada Council Art Bank published this year. The jury described his contributions as "remarkable and with purpose," and noted his efforts in paving the way for young artists. David Silcox lives in Toronto.

The Collectors' Club

There are many members of the CSPWC who like to collect the work of other elected members. The Collectors' Club will allow you to do that on an annual basis. For a donation to the CSPWC of \$50. you will be offered the opportunity to participate in the Collectors' Club. You will put forward a quality painting no smaller than 7" X 10". The painting will go to another member of the Collectors' Club and you will receive the work of someone else in the club. There is no guarantee of who's painting you will personally receive, because names will be selected at random and assigned sequentially down the list of participants for the year. Paintings will be assigned once a year shortly after November 1. The paintings will not be framed or matted.

The Rules

 Join the club at any time during the year prior to October 1 by donating \$50.
 to the CSPWC. This will secure you a place on the list for one year.

- 2. Get your painting ready for mailing by Oct. 1. The painting should be a quality piece, with an image size no smaller than 7" x 10". If you personally wish to use a larger piece that is up to you but you are only guaranteed a 7" x 10" piece in return.
- The drawing of names and distribution of works will occur shortly after Oct. 1, and will be completed by the end of November.
- 4. If you are an eager collector and wish to submit more than once you may do so. For example If you wish to donate \$100 and submit two of your own works that would be permissible.
- 5. You will be informed in November of the member who is to receive your painting. You will mail your unmatted, unframed piece to this person. You will receive your piece from another member who has been assigned to you through the draw.

Ann Balch CSPWC

New Brunswick's Ann Balch, an elected member of the Canadian Society of Painters in Water Colour (CSPWC) and the Society of Canadian Artists (SCA) is best known for her paintings of people.

Poppy Balser CSPWC

Poppy Balser lives in Digby, Nova Scotia. She has always lived within reach of the ocean, and the Bay of Fundy is an endless source of her inspiration. She finds the surrounding seashores and landscape translate well into watercolour paintings, and makes an effort to frequently paint "en plein air" or out-of-doors on location.



Christopher Gorey CSPWC SCA

Christopher Gorey was born and educated in the United States and graduated from the Massachusetts College of Art. After numerous painting excursions to Atlantic Canada he moved to the small coastal village of Ingonish on Cape Breton Island to take up painting full time.



Karin Isenburg CSPWC

Karin has been painting for over thirty five years. She has taken a number of courses in the Durham Region and Greater Toronto area including the Ontario College of Art & Design. She has spent countless hours in private study through Galleries and Libraries. Experimentation and a greater commitment has led to the development of layering transparent and semitransparent colour creating luminosity and a rich depth of colour in her work.





Rex Beanland CSPWC started painting in watercolour as a young child and has just never outgrown it. Something in that mysterious interaction between water and pigment continues to fascinate and inspire me. The nature of water is such that it can't be controlled and,

Bianka Guna CSPWC

Bianka Guna, artist and art teacher, is a non-objective painter, an honours graduate illustrator from the Minneapolis, MN US program, and beloved art teacher for a multitude of art groups and community centers in Ontario, Canada. She teaches water media (watercolour, acrylic, mixed



media, critique) abstract painting classes for adults at Koffler Centre for Arts, Neilson Park Creative Centre and Visual arts Mississauga, and at her Toronto studio.



Ron Hazell CSPWC SCA

Ron Hazell, a native of Nova Scotia, Canada is an internationally known artist and workshop instructor. In 1997 he was elected to the prestigious Canadian Society of Painters in Water Colour (CSPWC) In 2012, he was elected to the Society of Canadian Artists (SCA) Ron is best known for his light filled cityscapes

as well as his marine paintings.

Lio Lo CSPWC Lio Lo, born and raised in her native country Taiwan received her three year diploma in commercial art. After relocating to Shelburne, Nova Scotia she was much inspired with the nature beauty that surrounds her. She picked up her long abandoned brushes and committed full time painting in year 2000, primarily working in watercolour.

Watercolor is by nature an experimental medium. This upcoming juried exhibition is open to many forms of experimental uses of the water media from tradition approaches to experimental.

The Juror for this Exhibit is **Maurice Snelgrove CSPWC** is done through a professional 'blind jury process': meaning that at no time will the Juror know who the artist is who is presenting his/her work.

The Entry Fee is only \$35.00, which covers the submission of two paintings. Read the entry details as to how to submit, which we really hope that you do!:) Attached is a pdf as well as a j-peg of the entry form.

The criteria:

The water based media must be soluble in watercolour (artist's quality watercolour paint, applied transparently or opaquely; acrylic applied transparently). Other water based media: gouache, acrylic, ink, etc. must not make up more than 20% of the final painting.

The paint surface is an organic fiber paper, including watercolour paper mounted on board, canvas, yupo. Glass, plexi and varnish as a surface protectant are accepted.

Only media listed in the definition above are permissible. Application will be by hand, brush or any tool by the artist without mechanical assistance. Computer generated work will not be accepted.



remarks, she quoted Albert Einstein:


"I am enough of the artist to draw freely upon my imagination. Imagination is more important than knowledge. Knowledge is limited. Imagination encircles the world."





Government of Ontario Art Collection Acquisitions






