



For Richard, painting is also a way to assess his way of life, his ideals, his philosophy, where the do's and don't's are denounced at the risk of being labelled "politically incorrect".

JOHN W. REID

I graduated from the four year art course at Western Technical and Commercial School. Then I worked as a graphic designer and illustrator for ADS, and Sears and freelanced for most of my career.

Having worked in many mediums, watercolour was the medium I enjoyed the most, and since retirement have taken up painting full time working plein air as much as possible.

Taken workshops with Bria Atyeo, Doug Mays, Ed Mathews, David Taylor and painting holidays in Spain and France.

I am a member of CSPWC, Toronto Watercolour Society, Mississauga Watercolour Society and Peel Watercolour Artists. I live in Mississauga ON. With my wife Joan.

DORIS GOUDREAU DARBASIE

Edmonton-born Doris Goudreau Darbasie began her artistic journey in the 1980s, with studies at the University of Alberta Faculty of Extension, Grant MacEwan College, and workshops with artists of national and international stature. Darbasie's work is in private collections; selected paintings have been used as illustration by the City of Edmonton, reproduced as book-cover art by the University of Alberta Press, and Coteau Books, and featured in the internationally-distributed cultural magazine Le Sabord. Her paintings have been accepted into open, juried competitions of the Alberta Society of Artists, The Canadian Society of Painters in Water Colour, and the Federation of Canadian Artists. Darbasie is represented in Edmonton by Centre d'arts visuels de l'Alberta.

Of her work she says, "I derive most of my material from people, situations, and objects that are part of the urban setting in which I live. In my approach to still life I try to find subtleties and unusual qualities in what might at first appear to be the ordinary. I use light and shadow along with colour and texture to establish mood, and attempt to create a sense of mystery so that the work reveals itself as it is contemplated. In figure painting, performers are among my favourites. Musicians are especially challenging as I seek to capture something of the magic of their art."

GRACE QIAN XIAO

Grace's family moved from Shenzhen China to Winnipeg in May 2014 to start a new life.

She graduated from the Guangzhou Academy of Fine Arts University with a Bachelor Degree of Art Education in 1993 and had worked in a high school in China for 20 years in Arts Education.

Her work "Metropolis (Rainbow)" was collected by the Shenzhen Art Museum. Another work, "Dependency" was selected by the Open Water 2014-89th Annual Open Juried Exhibition.

Her first exposure with watercolor painting happened at university where she realized; "it is like a good horse, you need to know how to handle the horse, and otherwise you could lose control of it. But once you know the horse well, it will take you wherever you want to go." She usually uses the "Wet-in-Wet and Dry Brush Techniques" in her work and the quality of thickness and the intense contrast of color are most important to her. Most of her previous works are figure painting, using blocks of color, lines, texture, and atmosphere. She wishes to embrace the beautiful nature, the distinctive seasons and diversified cultures of Canada. It is the nation of her dreams and inspires her to paint more beautiful paintings.

LISA O'REGAN

Lisa O'Regan is passionate about her painting. Ideas for the next watercolor are constantly percolating away in her mind. She studied art at Champlain College and Concordia University.

Her main influences are Mary Whyte with whom she took a workshop, Steve Hanks and Andrew Wyeth. Her main subject matter is her daughters, a constant source of inspiration.

And as they grow her paintings reveal their evolution into young womanhood and a mother's awareness of who they are becoming. Her paintings are sensitive, masterful and a true expression of an artist's insights.

Lisa has been in Open Water three times in a row, since 2012, winning the AJ Casson medal award in 2014.

BRITTENY LINTICK

I am primarily interested in understanding life through relationships. I explore this theme through watercolour painting and work from photographs that capture objects 'as is' in day to day life. Colour and pattern catch my eye, enticing me to snap pictures of ordinary subjects composed naturally in a pre existing still life. The images are carefully chosen to highlight the often overlooked and mundane objects, and then painted to reflect a relationship, a story of what once was, or an observation of a moment in time.

A patchwork quilt made by my great grandmother inspired my fascination with our connection to objects such as textiles, which may go unnoticed. Exploring textiles as one of the primary subjects has since offered limitless opportunity to discover both conceptual and formal elements within the painting surface. I hope to signify these elements through a medium that is sometimes viewed as subordinate, and overlooked. Using traditional methods, I strive to create contemporary work that supports a stronger presence for watercolour, and ultimately, fuel the imagination.

VALERIE HARPER

My artistic source of inspiration comes mainly from the unspoiled magic of the natural world. I am particularly drawn to water and rocks - motion and shapes. For most of my life I have lived near water, the oceans of Australia, England, Bermuda and currently the beautiful rocky lakefront of N.D. Ile Perrot. I believe through all my travels, having observed beautiful diverse landscapes, has inspired me to paint, which I have been continuously exploring for over 30 years.

I paint watercolours boldly, often using one of my favourite techniques, thick paint on saturated paper. Beautiful transparent colour achieved by having mastered the techniques of controlling the spontaneous character of this medium, is my motivation. I also enjoy the challenges of abstraction and I incorporate abstracted backgrounds and features into many of my paintings. While portraying mood, feeling and expression, I strive for innovation.

There is nothing comparable to creating a completely personal and original piece of artwork. While portraying mood, feeling and expression, I strive to innovate and evoke the senses and passion in others through my work. The feeling of my waves exploding and the sensation of mist tumbling down a rocky cliff is the connection I wish to make with the viewer and is, undoubtedly, the intrinsic value of art itself.






(Central Ontario Regional Report cont.)



Experimental Watercolour

To the CSPWC Membership RE: WaterMedia

An important issue has been under discussion amongst the executive board lately. The subject has been about redefining our description of **Watermedia**.

Many artists are exploring new ways to handle watercolour in conjunction with other media and also in their choice of painting grounds and final presentation.

We are a society that has managed to survive financially mainly by our membership fees. If we are to continue to survive we need to attract new membership and the artists who are exploring these new areas would benefit us both by their creative energy and their \$.

Please keep in mind this takes nothing away from those who choose to maintain a classical transparent approach to watercolour. We always have and always will be a society that promotes and exhibits transparent watercolour.

However, this should not bar us from offering alternative options like **Watermedia**.

The final description of what constitutes **Watermedia** for the CSPWC will be determined by a vote of the membership.

Normally the board appoints a committee to examine a topic and then offers a recommendation for the membership to vote on. We wish we could do so in this case, but the views of the board ranged from minor change to considerable. We cannot offer a unified recommendation.


During the summer we will compile information on what is being done by **Watermedia** artists both in the CSPWC and abroad and we will devise a questionnaire that allows the membership to make informed choices on how we in the CSPWC will define **Watermedia**.


THE JULIUS GRIFFITH AWARD

What is the Julius Griffith Award?

The Julius Griffith Award is intended as the ultimate way of honouring an individual who has made a sustained and unique contribution to the life of the CSPWC.

This award is named after a beloved two-time President of the CSPWC who was responsible for the very survival of the Society through the sixties and seventies when it was very fashionable to renounce any society affiliations. It was through his determined efforts that the Annual Juried Shows continued and that a core group of members kept the concept of a national watercolour society alive. It is his selfless contribution that became the inspiration for an award intended to mark a unique and vital contribution made my an elected member. Generally, individuals considered for this award would have previously been elected to Life Membership. The award is to be presented no more than three times in a decade. It was first awarded in 2000 at the Society's 75th Anniversary celebrations.

The Julius Griffith Award is a bronze palm-sized sculpture of a hand holding a painter's brush and was commissioned from noted sculptor **Frances Gage RCA**. Nominations for this award can be made by any member who should forward a written nomination to the Executive Director of the Society outlining the contributions made by the nominee. The final decision on who receives the award is left to the Executive of the Society. No membership-wide vote is held on this award. There is no cash accompaniment to this award.

CSPWC Members who are represented at Windsor Castle will be interested to learn that the Royal Collection Trust has recently completed the re-photographing of the seventy five watercolours and they are all now cross-referenced to their respective RCIN [Royal Collection Inventory Number] meaning they are now viewable on-line. [Look up "Royal Collection Trust". then go to "Collections" and their insert your name or the RCIN. Your RCIN is shown opposite your name and work in the Wikipedia "Royal Collection Project" file.]

Can You Make a Contribution?

The CSPWC/SCPA Endowment Fund operates under the umbrella of The Toronto Community Foundation. It is probably the most important factor contributing to a stable financial future for the CSPWC/SCPA. The fund has been in operation since 2011 but it takes considerable time for people to join in the effort and to understand the importance of an endowment fund. If every member did this we would have a considerable sum of cash which would be enlarging in effectiveness on an ongoing basis. I know it would not be easy for some members to do this, but if it was done by those who can afford to do it, it would be appreciated by all those who would like to see our era leave a legacy for the future. Individuals make their contribution to the society in many different ways. If you can make any sort of donation to our endowment fund I urge you to do it. 

- 3. All paintings must be original, created by the artist who is submitting, and not previously shown in an Open Water
- 4. Open Water 2015 is strictly open to submissions painted in transparent watercolour, as defined in this call for entry
- The work must be original, be conceived and created by the artist making the submission.
- 6. The painting surface must be protected by Glass or Plexiglas, All works must be framed and ready for installation upon receipt. If mats or liners are used, they must be white or off-white. Maximum mat size of 4 inches (10.16cm).
- 7. Size of work. The maximum size of the submitted image is a full sheet, 22 x 30°, (55.89cm x 76.2cm). The minimum size of the submitted image is 14 sheet, 10° x 14° or 140 sq inches. (25.4cm x 35.56cm)
- 8. The jury and/or the exhibition chair, reserves the right not to hang any painting which does not conform to all the rules of the competition. This includes framing instructions and the medium.
 - If an accepted artist withdraws his/her work after the adjudication, he/she will be meligible to enter Open Water exhibitions for three years.
- Entries that are accepted for exhibition must remain on display until November 21, 2014
