



# To the CSPWC Membership RE: WaterMedia

An important issue has been under discussion amongst the executive board lately.

The subject has been about redefining our description of Watermedia.

Many artists are exploring new ways to handle watercolour in conjunction with other media and also in their choice of painting grounds and final presentation.

We are a society that has managed to survive financially mainly by our membership fees. If we are to continue to survive we need to attract new membership and the artists who are exploring these new areas would benefit us both by their creative energy and their \$.

Please keep in mind this takes nothing away from those who choose to maintain a classical transparent approach to watercolour. We always have and always will be a society that promotes and exhibits transparent watercolour.

However, this should not bar us from offering alternative options like **Watermedia**.

The final description of what constitutes **Watermedia** for the CSPWC will be determined by a vote of the membership.

Normally the board appoints a committee to examine a topic and then offers a recommendation for the membership to vote on. We wish we could do so in this case, but the views of the board ranged from minor change to considerable.

We cannot offer a unified recommendation.

During the summer we will compile information on what is being done by **Watermedia** artists both in the CSPWC and abroad and we will devise a questionnaire that allows the membership to make informed choices on how we in the CSPWC will define **Watermedia**.


# **Chris and Lynn Gorey Event**

It's that time of year again to encourage good watercolour painters to apply for elected membership in the Society. This call is especially directed to Associates "whose time maybe has come".

# The annual deadline for applying is November 1, 2015

All of the instructions for applying are included in the Mail-In Application which can be downloaded from the CSPWC web site <a href="https://www.cspwc.com">www.cspwc.com</a> under the link 'Membership' - 'Become a Member'. The application consists of photographs of six recent paintings in jpg format on a CD along with a Biography (maximum of two pages) in Word format. Last year there were twenty-five new applications (ten people were elected). I think we can top that number, so let's promote our society far and wide.

# The Margaret Wendy Marsh Memorial Fund

hen a charitable organization folds there are bylaw rules that specify government approved ways of disposing of remaining funds. Generally this means that the funds of charitable organizations are bequeathed to other charitable organizations upon their demise. Such a happy circumstance has recently befallen the CSPWC/SCPA. The **Seguin Arts Council** in Seguin Township, one municipality south of Parry Sound, and part of The District of Parry Sound, has recently wound down its operations, and in the process it has transferred the remaining funds of the Wendy Marsh Memorial Fund to the CSPWC/SCPA. The executive has transferred these funds to The Toronto Foundation where our other endowment funds are lodged and administered.

The late **Wendy Marsh** (1943-1992) played a strong part in the establishment of the Seguin Arts Council. Upon her death a memorial fund was established to the benefit of The Arts and Seguin Arts Council. The Arts Council administered these funds up until this year, at which time they have ceased to exist as an arts council. Since Wendy was a strong supporter of the arts and her artist husband Peter Marsh CSPWC, Peter, upon being kindly consulted by The Seguin Arts Council, thought that it would be appropriate that the funds be transferred to an arts organization and one especially dear to his heart. Wendy was an administrator for various organizations so the interest from these funds will be directed to the administration of the society. The Fund at The Toronto Foundation has been named The Margaret

Wendy Marsh Memorial Fund, an endowment using only the interest accrued annually so that the fund will have a positive use in Wendy's name in perpetuity, a situation of which Wendy would have been very proud.

Donations to this particular memorial fund or to The CSPWC/SCPA Endowment Fund at The Toronto Foundation help to ensure a strong financial base for the future of the CSPWC/SCPA. Your interest is solicited in following these developments so that you too will at some point make your own contribution to a secure financial future for an organization proudly representing Canadian Watercolour Artist.

# A Workshop with Tony Van Hasselt

I took a watercolour painting workshop with **Tony Van Hasselt** this past July, in Belfast, Maine, USA.

Tony starts his workshops by telling jokes and making the group feel comfortable and relaxed. He has been doing this for a long time. A former student of **Edgar Whitney**, Tony has developed a visual aids system to help students critique their work according to design principles taught by Whitney. Classes always begin with jokes and banter followed by according to weather a plein air or in studio demonstration.

As he paints, he explains his reasoning. Although he talks about Tone, Balance, Depth and Gradation, his main emphasis is on profile shapes to identify content, which he describes as Silhouette Shapes (for example roof corners of buildings), Dominance and Focal Point, which are self explanatory and

Alternation, which is repetition with variety and based on tonal contrast. I have also heard this principle described as Tonal Interchange or the Paper Doll effect. Whatever you call it, it gives visual excitement to a painting.

His painting approach is based on layering washes. His easel is tilted almost vertically and gravity creates interesting gradations and

sedimentary granulations. The scene to be painted is first carefully observed, then one or two monotone thumbnails are created with particular attention to Alternation and Silhouette Shapes. Trees, buildings, clouds, dogs, cats and seagulls may all be repositioned in the painting to provide Balance and allow the Focal Point to dominate. He refers often to his thumbnail plan as he paints and never overworks a passage.

He uses mostly long flats (sign writers lettering brushes) for precise edges with a pulled stroke and rough edges (tree top silhouettes) with a pushed stroke. He also uses a rigger to describe branches, phone lines, sailboat masts etc. As a wash dries he scratches into it with fingernails or a knife and spatters with paint or water drops. The demo is a performance, done with care, confidence and obvious pleasure.

The finished painting is very impressionistic, full of vitality and gives the impression of effortlessness. One might never guess how precisely it was planned and how carefully considered was each paint stroke. And that was possibly his most important lesson. "Not planning a painting is planning the painting to fail".

# Jean Pederson hosts the Rusty Nailers

We all dream of visiting great painting locations, but this summer a few of us were lucky enough to be hosted by the renowned painter Jean Pederson. Actually a bunch of us painted in Algonguin Park in 2008 at The Rangers Cabin at the north end near

Britt. Discussing our paintings around the fire in the evening we would enjoy a rusty nail, so we became *The Rusty Nail Painters*. 
