# **About Visions Adjoin**

Visions Adjoin records a historic milestone for two of the foremost artistic societies in North America. In 2020, the National Watercolor Society in the United States of America celebrates its one-hundredth year while the Canadian Society of Painters in Water Colour marks its ninety-fifth year. The leaders of both societies happily agreed to collaborate on an important juried exhibition of outstanding works by their finest water-media artists. The exhibition entitled 'Visions Adjoin' will be presented first at the NWS Gallery in San Pedro, California, USA, from February 6 — April 17, 2020, and later from June 10th - July 18th, it will appear at the Helson Gallery in Halton Hills, Ontario, Canada.



# **Diploma Collection Photography Session**

# **January 2020 at Pama**

The CSPWC's **National Diploma Collection** has been held at PAMA, The Peel Art Gallery, Museumand Archives in Brampton Ontario since 1995. Under the direction of a new curator at PAMA, it was decided that our Collection could no longer be cared for as it deserved to be due in part to its extremely large size and need for storage space.

Prior to moving all the paintings we were afforded the opportunity to bring in a photographer of our choice to document each and every piece. Mr. Manny Martins of Brampton spent 4 days photographing the pieces with the assistance of staff members of PAMA and several CSPWC volunteers under the supervision of Marlene Madole, CSPWC Past President and PAMA liaison.

We now have a high resolution photo of each piece. In addition to the photography, there have been other costs incurred for us to relocate the collection. Some expenses are still unknown, but costs we can anticipate will include moving costs, insurance, short-term storage etc. We are very pleased to say that thanks to the generosity of many of our members over \$3300.00 have been raised to date. Many thanks to all who have contributed to this worthy cause.
























# **Doreen Renner**

The show will feature a variety of media including linocut prints and stencils, mixed media drawings, acrylic paintings and, of course, watercolours. It will be held at the Helen Schuler

Nature Center in Lethbridge throughout the month of May and will be accompanied by workshops in watercolour for both teens and adults. This is an important milestone for Sherry as it is the first one-man exhibition she has held in the past 20 years and signals a return to full-time painting after 30 years of teaching.

Mary has forged impressive parallel careers as both a nurse and an artist, each reinforcing the other. Mary's passion for ageing is the muse for stunning works of art. Mary is currently co-chair of the Edmonton Seniors Coordinating Council Board of Directors and a changemaker for Age Friendly Edmonton's Ageism Hub. As a nurse with a specialization in gerontology, Mary sees great beauty in the ageing process, as shown in her blog, Beauty in Ageing. Through her artwork, Mary examines ageing through a different lens that offers a paradigm shift from the negativity of

ageism. In stark contrast to the negative stereotypical depictions of seniors as "frail", Mary's artwork depicts the strength and resilience of older adults rendered in stunning portraiture. Mary advocates for questioning the unconscious bias that is ageism. She provides insights on how we can reshape our views of ageing into a positive process. Just as race, religion, ethnicity and gender contribute to our society's rich diversity, so too does age. While Mary works towards a positive ageing visual language, the Ageism Hub is challenging people to rethink the spoken language they use to describe ageing and older adults. Both languages endeavor to shift how we think, feel and behave about ageing so we can embrace its many positive aspects.


# Anne McCartney

Australia for a sabbatical. She wanted something to do with her time and watercolour was convenient and portable so she tried it. She loves the fact that you can't control watercolour and that it always surprises you.

She paints 7 days a week for 8 hours a day and has received many awards including 2 awards from Italy this year. She has also



been shortlisted for an award in the Fabriano Show in Italy.

She was honoured to become a member of the CSPWC. It was inspiring to be recognized as having achieved the level of this Society. She is committed to furthering her skills with watercolour as she feels she has so much to learn.
