
97th Annual International Open Water Exhibition 2022

Our jurors were all international artists from France, England, and the United States. 
CSPWC Open Water 2022 online exhibit

There were so many beautiful paintings that were submitted and of course it would have been fantastic to be able to exhibit them all. However, sixty (60) paintings were selected.







Coming soon from the Education Committee

Do you feel overwhelmed trying to paint a countryside full of detail? Learn how to edit what you see, by responding to the main shapes before adding only the most necessary smaller details.

Learn how to let what you see in the landscape guide your hand in expressive brushwork.

Live online demo on December 10, 2023, at 1 pm Eastern. Ticketholders will have access to a recording of the demo for 2 months- note: tickets for recording must be purchased in advance of the live event.

What will you learn from this demonstration?

- How to plan and execute a direct watercolour painting, with little or no underlying pencil work
- How to speak out loud your plan before touching brush to paper
- How to divide the painting into manageable sections, i.e. into shapes or planes
- How to be open to editing on the fly: you will hear Uma's thinking as she makes choices throughout the painting process
- To accept that your painting may have to go through an awkward and unreadable phase before you can bring it to a satisfactory completion
- How to embrace watercolour "accidents" and give them a place in your work
- How to use a variety of brushstrokes to give a sense of separate vegetation planes


Uma paints directly, using little to no initial pencil work. She will teach you how to manage the large variety of landscape shapes from largest to smallest. You will become comfortable with the abstract shapes and markings your brushes can make, and to find the rhythm of the shapes to paint efficiently and confidently.

About Uma Kelkar:

UMA KELKAR (California, USA) is an entrepreneur + engineer + watercolor painter from San Jose. She is an award winning plein air artist with mastery over multiple media including watercolor, ink, charcoal and digital painting. Colour harmony, composition and fearlessness to explore topics and media gives her work its unique energy. Having taken part in multiple national and international juried shows, she teaches painting locally and internationally. She is a firm believer in cross-pollination and believes that being an artist makes her a better engineer and being an engineer makes her a better artist.



In Memoriam

Ray Cattell 1921-2022



We've received the sad news of the passing of one of our treasured elected members, **Ray Cattell**.


Born in England in 1921, Ray was attending the Birmingham College of Art when his studies were cut short by war service. He served from 1940-1946 in the Royal Navy on the King George V Battleship.

He moved to Canada in 1954 and became a prominent painter, graphic designer, muralist and commercial artist. He held senior executive positions with the Royal Canadian Academy of Arts, the Ontario Society of Artists, and the Art Directors' Club of Toronto.

He was the president of the Canadian Society of Painters in Water Colour from 1977 – 1979. And though not confirmed, was involved with the creation and design of our current logo.

His painting, *Wind's Moment*, is in the CSPWC Diploma Collection. Painted in 1990 it was acquired on March 20, 1992, with the inaugural 81 Diploma paintings.

He became a Life Member in 1996 and the 3rd recipient of the Julius Griffith Award and won the Honour Award 3 times, (now known as the A.J. Casson) only one of a handful to have done so. Ray was part of exhibitions too many to mention, and held a number of one-man exhibitions, winning numerous awards including being honoured as one of ten remarkable artists in the CSPWC "Treasures" exhibition, 2010.

A major retrospective of his work was held in 2015 at the Arts & Letters Club. And his daughters share that even at the end of his days, he kept envisioning a speech he wanted to give at the Arts & Letters Club with reminiscences about the people he met there.

He maintained his great sense of humour and love of life until the very end.

He died at the age of 101 in the care of his family and Belmont House. His wife of 79 years predeceased him on June 2nd, 2022.

CSPWC members will recall his sense of humor and generosity throughout the years and send their deepest condolences to his family.
